

This year's Franklin Train Show is in the books and I wanted to share some information from that show with you. I love getting to write fun Superintendent messages for the Rusty Spike. This one is more of a mixed bag and some of it isn't fun at all to write but transparency is important. I want to start by thanking Mike Roderick and his staff for a fantastic show! Thank you all for the hard work you put into making the show a success! Here's the good stuff. On Saturday our show attendance was roughly 280 people more than the entire 2023 attendance. Sunday's attendance was softer as is always the case but we had a strong attendance! Large air coolers were in the non air conditioned buildings and it really made a difference. We had additional help this year as the Boy Scouts helped us out with tear down and keeping our vendors hydrated by passing out water.

We also added a new building this year. That was a real adventure. The space added 20,000 square feet to the size of the show, effectively doubling it. That is the upside. The downside is that the floor in that building is dirt. Very compact dirt but dirt. Michael and Randy Bowman worked to get co-sponsors for the show to help fix that issue. 84 Lumber and Carter Lumber donated over enough cement board and OSB to put down a wooden floor. That's the great news. Unfortunately the condition of the floor when we got the building was too poor to use the materials as they would have caused a lot of uneven joints and significant tripping hazards. When Michael and Randy plan out this show each year they swing for the fences. I applaud their effort. If you are a fan of baseball you can attest that sometimes when you are swinging for the fences and looking for that home run you can end up striking out. That is what happened with the new building. We tried, we swung mighty, but at the end of the day, it was a strike out.

With increasing advertising costs and increased facilities fees for the extra space, the show brought in less profit than last year but was still very profitable.

Now for the bad news. With that poor floor came unhappy dealers. We missed on the signage, it was a new building we had not used before and attendees were not familiar, and the floor was terrible. Overall the CID took a bit of a black eye on using that building. At the August board meeting I suggested we refund all vendor table fees to the vendors who were in the that building. That is not a minor of amount of refunds. We sold a bit over 100 tables and charged \$22 per table. The board agreed that the right thing to do was return the fees to the vendors. The division is well off financially and it makes sense to try to repair some of those vendor relationships that were a bit banged up. As I write this we are in the process of returning fees along with an apology letter written by myself and Michael. The show remains in the black but with a much thinner profit at the end of the refunds. There was one other aspect the CID was able to turn to a positive on this. Remember the 20,00 square feet of cement board and OSB? We donated the OSB to Habitat for Humanity to use in new housing. We are still working on donating the cement board. Either to Habitat for Humanity or to a new location.

What does that mean for the future of the show? Well, that depends greatly on the next few months. We we love to move. So much so that the name of the show is changing to unlock it from Franklin. We are looking at a couple of different facilities closer to Franklin and also at a new facility, Nexus Center, in Columbus. Any of these could be the new home to the show. A significant issue with Columbus is that the largest building is a multi user sports complex with you guessed it, a dirt floor. We are talking with them about donating the cement board to get them on their way towards having a solution of a wood floor, increasing their opportunities to rent the facility. We may not be able to use any of them and that means we will be at Franklin again, but NOT using the dirt floor building. We learned our lesson there! We are continuing to look for more partnership and cosponser ideas for this show.

I wanted to personally let each CID member know how the show went, how we decided to take much less of a profit in order to do the right thing. We hope that the membership is happy with what we have done with the CID's funds and resources to make the best of the unfortunate circumstances we found ourselves in. 
